STOP HEALTH MISINFORMATION

Inaccurate information about your health can put you in danger. Examples of this includes...

- Disinformation about a cosmetic that can cause cancer
- Getting people to starve themselves in order to get skinnier
- Persuading others to not follow public health measures

In order to check if the information you were given is true or not, you can follow these few steps.

1. Question a reliable source about the claim that has been made. This includes asking your doctor, nurses etc.



2. Search up the information on the internet to check if it has been verified.

3. You can check if the source is accurate or not by opening the "About Us" page on the website

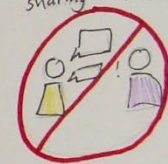

3. By working with your community, you can create strategies against misinformation



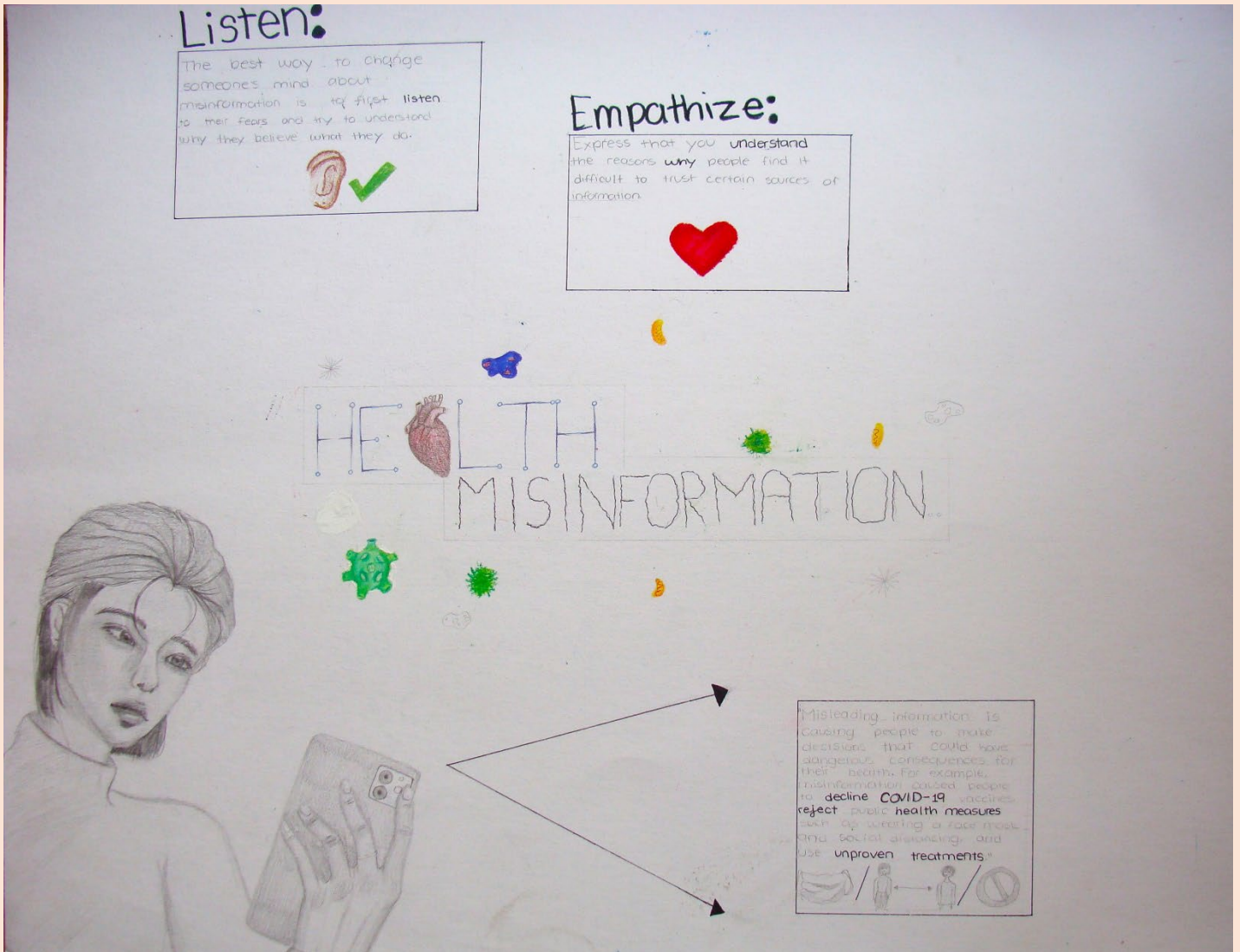
Utilize the following strategies when talking to friends and family about misinformation

- Try to use inclusive language.



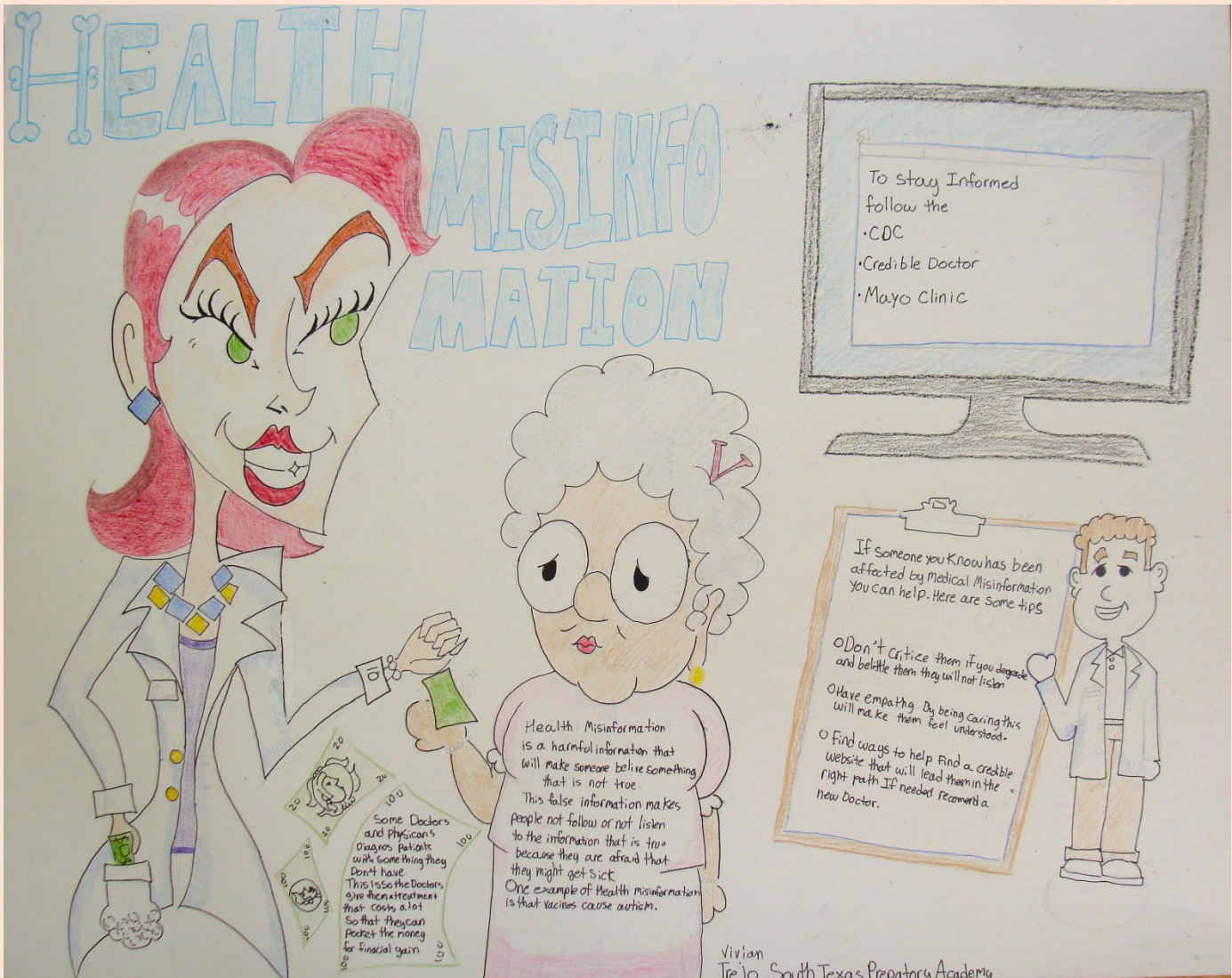
