TIMELINE

- January 6: 2021 Virtual Texas Area Conference Registration Deadline for all areas
- January 13: Photos of poster and page with information normally on the back of the poster due to Tallo by 11:59 pm CST
- January 23: Virtual Opening Session for all areas
- January 20: Conference Registration fees due
- February 10: Virtual Grand Awards Session All Areas @ 2:00 pm CST

GUIDELINE MODIFICATIONS: View rubric <u>HERE</u>

- Each competitor will submit 1-3 photos of his/her poster. The photos the competitor takes are at his/her discretion and should highlight the poster in the best possible way.
- Competitors will submit: 1) 1-3 photos of the poster; 2) Page with information normally on label affixed to the back of the poster
- Competitors will upload their materials to the Medical Art Poster event opportunity on Tallo following the instructions outlined on the <u>HOSA/Tallo Instructions Page</u>.
- Uploads must be complete by January 13. The uploaded materials are what the judges will use to score competitors.
- If you do not upload your materials, there is no content to be judged, therefore no score will be given. Judges will receive materials on January 13, so if you miss the January 13 upload deadline, your material will not be sent to judges.
- <u>Pro Tip #1</u>: Practice uploading your links to Tallo prior to the January 13 deadline. You can upload materials to the event opportunity in Tallo, and then delete/edit/re-upload materials up until the January 13 deadline.
- <u>Pro Tip #2</u>: Do not wait until the last day to upload. Try to upload your materials before the deadline. If something goes wrong, you have time to troubleshoot!

- Competitors will need to upload their materials to Tallo a smartphone, tablet, or computer are needed to upload.
