The University of Texas MD Anderson Cancer Center offers a summer program to recent high school graduates. For seven weeks, participants will interact with School of Health Professions faculty five days a week, from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. in state-of-the-art [School of Health Professions](#) facilities. The program offers hands-on experiences in college-level molecular, cellular, and microbiological laboratory techniques, as well as in-depth workshops in Medical Dosimetry, Radiation Therapy and Diagnostic Imaging.

If selected, participants will receive a scholarship for the seven-week period. This scholarship is meant solely to subsidize cost of living expenses for students so they may participate in the program. The scholarship is considered income and subject to all applicable taxes and fees.
